The Canada Line is proud to announce that the film *City Reflections* has won two notable awards - a City of Vancouver Heritage Award of Honour (the top award category) and an Award of Merit from the British Columbia Historical Federation. Canada Line provided a grant to assist in the production of the film and we are very proud of the film's achievements.

The City of Vancouver Heritage Awards are broken down into three categories; the Award of Recognition, the Award of Merit, and the Award of Honour.

Other Award of Honour recipients this year include the Vancouver Art Gallery for the book *Fred Herzog: Vancouver Photographs* and the acclaimed exhibition of the same name in 2007; the Salient Group for their restoration of the Flack Block; the Portland Society for the restoration of the Pennsylvania Hotel; the owners of Greencroft, for a beautiful restoration of this English Arts and Crafts home; Cheryl Cooper for her successful campaign to save the late Arthur Erickson's Evergreen building.

Other City Reflections News:

A Teachers' Resource Guide was printed to accompany the DVD and was made available to schools in the Vancouver School Board system. Many teachers have expressed great interest in using the film to teach their students about the history of Vancouver and to encourage them to discover the history of their own neighbourhoods.

Every branch of the Vancouver Library system has also received a copy of the DVD so that members of the public can review the film too.

As the Vancouver Historical Society is a non-profit group, proceeds from the sale of the DVDs are being used to fund other historical projects. Grants have been made to the Vancouver City Archives and the Vancouver Public Library Special Collections Division to digitize some of their archival holdings so that anyone in future may look at them from their home computer.
